

Dear Principals,

My time as pastor at St. Patrick's will come to an end shortly. As much as I knew (even when I started 13 years ago in 2011!) that I would have to face this reality one day, it is still very hard to share these words — whether it be in person, on zoom, on a phone call or through an email like this one. A part of me wishes I did not have to, that we could just keep being co-labourers together in the Lord's vineyard, finding Christ in our neighbour, serving Christ in our neighbour, helping our neighbour find Christ in themselves, particularly as it relates to our school communities. But, the reality is that I am not here permanently, that I must leave at some point.

I have been extremely blessed to have spent thirteen amazing years at St. Patrick's. It is not always that priests have this length of time in a parish community. So, really I have nothing but gratitude in my heart for being allowed to share in the priesthood of Jesus Christ and his ministry as a pastor at St. Patrick's for this long. Now, I am being summoned to another place in the Lord's vineyard and carry out the priestly ministry of Jesus Christ in a new setting. Where that will be I do not know at this time.

When exactly am I leaving? My term as pastor ends December 31<sup>st</sup> so I will leave the parish January 1<sup>st</sup>. Why at this time? Don't clergy moves happen typically at the end of June? The reason for my leaving January 1<sup>st</sup> is that I have been granted a sabbatical. Again, I am very grateful that Archbishop Leo had granted me this reprieve to step back from parish ministry so that I can recalibrate as a priest, reset my spiritual compass points and just try to ready myself for whatever God has in store for me.

I ask for your prayers during these next weeks. My prayer is that I receive the grace to detach myself in a healthy way, be able to express my heartfelt and deep gratitude and love for you all in the time I have left and then open myself to wholeheartedly embrace what it is the Lord is calling me into come the spring of 2025. I will be sharing the news of my departure with the whole parish this weekend at all the Sunday masses. In the meantime be assured of my prayers for you and for your school communities. It has truly been a blessing to collaborate with each of you in the animating and the celebrating of our Christian faith. May God continue to abundantly bless you, strengthen you and lead you.

# Primary and Junior 2023-2024 EQAO RESULTS

The Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) has released provincial, school- and boardlevel data from its 2023-2024 assessments, which marks the third consecutive year of the agency's reporting on the student achievement results of its online provincial assessments. EQAO data provide an independent snapshot that shows whether students are meeting curriculum expectations in reading, writing and mathematics at key stages of their education. The results also provide additional insights into students' attitudes and perceptions related to their learning.




